TELEWEB COURSES - TeleWeb courses are designed to accommodate the educational needs of students who have access to and experience with a computer and the Internet and access to a television and DVD player.

WEB COURSES - Online courses are designed to accommodate the educational needs of students who have access to and experience with a computer and the Internet.

VIDEOCONFERENCING COURSES - The videoconferencing system is a network of classrooms connected by compressed-video technology. The classrooms are equipped with cameras, monitors, and other equipment that allows teachers and students to interact as if they are in the same room. Instructors can use traditional visuals, such as slides, and videos.

BLENDED COURSES - Blended courses require students to come on-campus for certain activities such as labs, presentations, or speeches. Students complete the lecture portion of the class without coming to campus.

NEW CLASS OFFERING

This fall, NW-SCC is offering REL 151 (Survey of the Old Testament). For many majors, REL 151 will satisfy the fine arts/humanities elective needed in Area II of the STARS agreement. This course is an introduction to the content of the Old Testament with emphasis on the historical context and contemporary theological and cultural significance of the Old Testament. The student should have an understanding of the significance of the Old Testament writings upon completion of this course. Dr. Clarence Johnson, who is retired from Athens State University, will be teaching REL 151 as a web-based course.
